MINUTES OF THE AGM HELD ON SATURDAY 15TH OCTOBER 2016, 2.30pm

Approval of October 2015 Minutes:

The minutes of the last AGM held on Saturday 17th October 2015 were unanimously agreed then proposed as a correct record by Chris Hearn and seconded by Meg Aldwinckle.

Outstanding Action from previous Meeting:

There were no matters arising from the previous meeting

Extra discussion points as listed on the Agenda:

BRS Progress

Everyone was reminded that our section is still getting used to the new system, and did anyone have any comments? Chris Hearn commented that she preferred it. Gill Olke asked Ben if it was correct that BRS could do even more for us. Ben responded that it would be best to get fully comfortable with the new ways of working, after which it may be possible to consider further options. Judy asked Ben when the tee times for 2017 would be entered on BRS. Ben responded that he was still waiting for information from the men's and seniors' sections.

Club Championship Format

Nicci Parsons asked for assurance that ladies' 3-balls should not have to follow men's 4-balls. Denise Harker asked for it to be noted that the greens were not in the best condition for the 2016 ladies' championship, whereas they were in top condition for the men's competition. Could attention be paid to this in 2017. The committee had been asked to consider the best format for the championship in 2017 and it was decided to put it to the vote. Accordingly, a voting form was made available at the AGM on which ladies could vote for a 1-day, or 2-day competition, or to abstain if they did not mind either way or did not intend to participate in the competition. The form was then pinned to the ladies' noticeboard so that non-attendees at the AGM could add their vote. Email votes could also be sent to Judy or Hilary. Closing date for voting to be 6pm on October 29th. Judy mentioned that two alternative dates had been identified, in case the result meant that the club championship became a 2 day event.

Topics for Management: Gill explained that this list (attached to these minutes) comprised issues the ladies wished to discuss with management.

- 1. Management attendance at committee meetings:** Glen responded that management would always try to attend our meetings - if someone was available. If they had nothing to report to us, no report would be forthcoming. Glen and Ben confirmed that their office door was always open if anyone wanted to discuss anything. Going forward, they would ensure apologies were submitted if they could not attend.
- 2. Tee Times:** Ben confirmed he was working with Judy, who has submitted the ladies' tee time requests for weekend competitions. Judy had previously consulted the committee on this list to help to ensure expectations were met wherever possible. He assured the ladies that he

makes every effort to respond quickly to emails telling him of gaps that need closing, etc (example: the Winners Cup) and take appropriate action.

3. **Catering & Hospitality:** Judy has made available to Ben a list of our function room requirements for the coming year. It is hoped that this will avoid the risk of function clashes – it being accepted that hospitality space is at a premium at the club. Gill commented that she was happy with the catering provided for functions during her year and that Michael was a good addition to the catering team. Glen agreed that improvements to standards and consistency could still be made, whilst acknowledging that level of business is high, external feedback is generally good and the functions rooms were busy.
4. **Membership Fees:** With regard to the 7-day fees – Ben and Glen stated that demand dictates the cost. Weekend play on the course is very busy and there is a waiting list for 7-day membership.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. *Treasurers Report*

Copies of the accounts have been distributed.

The accounts for the year ended 30 September 2016 show a surplus of £324 compared to a surplus of £95 for the previous year.

The Ladies section continues to show a healthy financial position with reserves standing at £1,977 made up of £3,209 cash at the bank less £1,232 for outstanding expenses.

I would just like to thank Terry Coombes who kindly volunteered to review the accounts again this year, and if anyone has any questions I will be happy to answer them.

If not, can I please have a proposer and seconder for the approval of the accounts.

2. *Competitions Report*

When I thought about writing this year's competitions report I read through Meg's report for last year and her final comment before handing over was 'I will be able to concentrate on my own golf for a change'. I now know what she meant, having received a barrage of questions every time I walked through the door on competition days, by the same token I can also use it as a good excuse as to why I played so badly this year, I think it's all your fault! The plan was for Dawn and I to split the competitions, with me concentrating on the regular Medals and Stablefords, and Dawn on the Major competitions at weekends, as well as the Eclectics, Order of Merit and Jubilee Trophy records. Half way through the year we decided that it would be far easier if Dawn took on responsibility for the weekend ladies competitions and I think this has worked well for both of us. It has also been the year of the introduction to the BRS system which is still in the early days of use, I hope you will all continue to make every effort to get to know how the system works and Dawn and I will continue to give you a sheet on the board so that you can see who you are playing with and your tee times.

Gill's year has seen most of her competitions blessed with really good weather, unlike poor Hilary who started off with a hurricane. We have played a few competitions with the men this year and will continue to do so next year, Judy has had long conversations with next year's captains and they are very keen for a closer integration of all the sections and are planning to play more of our qualifying competitions together. This year we have again offered the ladies the option 9 hole competitions, but there has not been much demand, remember ladies that you can play just 9 holes and still retain your handicap.

3. *Handicaps Report (read out by Jane Marr in Kath Coombes' absence)*

At the end of September there were 53 players with a competition handicap, 51 of these have played in competitions at Kings Hill during the last year.

Well done to Debbie who has cut her handicap by 6 shots, 2 excellent rounds of golf in the last week

3 juniors have reduced their handicaps by 4 shots, Maria Babadi, Olivia and Charlotte Heard, well done to all of them.

Well done to Heather Dunne who has reduced her handicap by 3 shots, 11 ladies have reduced their handicaps by 1 shot

Five new ladies have been added to the handicap list during the past year.

Lisa Babadi was given a handicap of 20 and has managed to reduce it by 3 shots down to 17.

Georgia Robins is now on our list as an away member and she has a playing handicap of 24.

Susannah Rayner has joined us from Nizels and she has a handicap of 36.

Vivien Stoner now has Kings Hill as her home club, she also plays at Nizels and has a handicap of 19

Kate Downing a player new to golf has just been given a handicap of 36.

Karen Fleet has put in 1 card and hopefully about to put in her 2nd

Elaine Lewis has recently started playing again after her illness and is putting in cards to regain her handicap

One of the new changes to the handicap system is that a handicap can be increased by 1 shot if a player has seven 0.1 consecutive increases, 3 ladies have been given a 1 shot increase, one player declined the increase

Two ladies have been given 2 extra shots on return from injury or illness.

The back 9 has now been measured for 9 hole competitions, this will make it easier for any lady who wants to play a nine hole competition in the winter. At the moment only 1 lady has wanted to play in any of the 9 hole competitions, but this may change during the winter. The 9 hole competitions can be played alongside any of the monthly medal or stableford competitions

I would like to thank Meg and Chris for their help in making any handicap decisions during the year.

Also thank you Gill for all your hard work during the year.

4. Captain's Report

Thanks also to the ground staff for an excellent course on which we play, news about that a little later given to us from Barry, thanks also to the bar and catering staff for looking after us, and thank heaven for the working relationship I quickly developed with Ben.

Maybe some of our social events and friendlies fell by the way this year, and we must work hard to ensure we don't lose sight of the lighter side of our golf and try harder to support as many events as we personally can. I had said that I would do my level best to represent the club and to make myself available as often as possible to discuss your issues or just to play with as many ladies as possible during the year. Well, I truthfully think I can tick that box. My captaincy has meant that I have been elevated to the higher echelons of the 7 day member, a status I have enjoyed so much that I fully intend to continue henceforth, dragging a friend along with me.
