

Kings Hill Seniors
Winter Eclectic Competition Rules

This competition is played every winter, starting in October and ending in the following March - the exact dates will be confirmed when the details are announced.

1. Players must pay the entry fee (currently £3) before commencing their first round.
2. Players must declare, before teeing off, that they wish to submit a card for the Eclectic. You must inform your playing partners and mark your card distinctly with a capital "E" and circle the tee used. If no tee is marked, then yellow will be assumed. **Please note that, as the white and yellow tees are often aligned during the winter months, the committee decided in 2015 that ALL future eclectic rounds will be deemed as being played from the yellow tees until further notice.**
3. Players must record their current EXACT handicap on each card submitted
4. Cards will only be accepted if correctly marked and signed by a member of Kings Hill Seniors. (Marker must print name to verify signature). The player is responsible for submitting and signing for a correctly marked and completed card.
5. Players can submit a maximum of 10 cards for the competition. All cards marked with an "E" must be submitted. Cards not correctly marked and completed will not count for the competition but will count towards the maximum of 10 cards.
6. Cards can be entered from the Monday Swindle, any senior or club competition or indeed from any casual play – as long as it is marked by a Senior (see 4 above). **Cards from all seniors (or club) competitions need to be retained by the club; so any "E" cards from these will need to be duplicated (or photocopied) before being submitted. Swindle cards do not need to be duplicated unless the original is needed for handicap revision. Completed cards are to be placed in the Seniors Folder in the Office or handed directly to the Eclectic Coordinator.**

Handicaps

As the SSS for the yellows is one less than the whites, for yellow tee rounds a players exact handicap will be reduced by one and his handicap will then be averaged over all rounds played. His eclectic handicap, as shown on the results table, is then taken by multiplying this average by an eclectic handicap allowance which is currently set at 75% - ie $\frac{3}{4}$ handicap allowance.

Results

The ongoing scores and positions will be updated every month during the competition and will be posted on the Seniors' website and notice board.

Prizes

There will be prizes for the lowest nett score and runner up for both the Low Handicap and High Handicap categories. The breakpoint, which will based on players' EXACT handicaps (not playing handicaps), will be decided once all entries have been received to ensure a balanced number of players are in each category. A player's category will be decided by his exact handicap at the start of the competition. A player will not change category during the competition!
